

Internship within Europe

Danish and other EU citizens are free to do internship within the EU. No visa is required.

When you reach your destination you may be required to inform the local authorities that you stay in the city for the coming period to do internship.

Erasmus Scholarship

The Erasmus+ programme supports internship stays in the [programme countries](#).

Usually the Erasmus scholarship will amount to 350-400 Euro per full month.

It is possible to apply for an Erasmus internship scholarship even though you have previously received an Erasmus scholarship for a study exchange. However, the total Erasmus scholarship period must not exceed 12 month in each level of education.

How to do:

- 1) You fill out the normal KEA internship contract
- 2) When your internship supervisor has approved it, the contract is sent to the company and you by e-mail
- 3) When both the company and you has approved the contract, KEA Global is advised about it
- 4) Within 2 weeks from the final approval, KEA Global will contact you with information about how to apply for the Erasmus scholarship

Insurance

When a foreign company takes you in as an intern, the local rules and regulations for insurance of students, who do internship as a mandatory part of their education, must be observed.

In some countries the companies are obliged to insure the intern, while in other countries it is the intern's own responsibility to take out the appropriate insurance.

When you make an agreement with a foreign company you should always ask the company if you are covered by their:

- Workers' compensation insurance
- Liability insurance

If you are covered by the company's insurance:

Before you go on an internship in another EU-country, you must remember to obtain a blue European Health Insurance card. Your yellow card is not valid. The card is free and can be ordered online at www.borger.dk

Besides, it is a good idea to take out travel insurance in order to be better covered in case of illness and if home transportation is needed.

If you are not covered by the company's insurance:

Before you begin an internship in another EU country, you must remember to obtain a blue European Health Insurance card. Your yellow card is not valid. The card is free and can be ordered at www.borger.dk

Furthermore it is important to take out a:

- Full time accident insurance** which covers in case of injury at the internship company. If you already have an accident insurance, it probably only covers you in your spare time.

- Liability insurance** which covers if you accidentally break things or hurt people while you are working as an intern. If you already have a private liability insurance, it will probably only cover you in your spare time
