

Branding was rewarding as it reminded me a lot of what we learn at Creative Branding at KEA. The teacher was very professional and tought us a lot of good theory.


WHAT COURSES DID I FIND THE LEAST REWARDING AND WHY?



Cultural Experience

Lisbon is a vibrant and beautiful city. The people are warm and welcoming and there is always an exiting corner or corridor to stroll by. The city is very hilly and, coming from the flat Copenhagen, it took a few weeks to get used to. The city is around the same size as Copenhagen and it's easy to get around either with the Navegante card or with Uber/Bolt which is very cheap.

The food is amazing in Portugal and i recommend trying out as much food as you can. Pastel de Nata is a must!

The beaches are close to the city and easily accessable with train. If you travel the country, there are endless beautiful beaches worth a visit.

The school culture was a bit different than what I had been used to in Denmark.
