1. Where and when did you study abroad?

- In Bruges, Belgium at Howest in the spring semester of 2024

2. What KEA program did you attend at the time?

- Computer Science (Datamatiker)

3. What classes did you take during your semester abroad? Please briefly explain what each class was about.

- Object Oriented Programming: Java, Classes and Objects etc.

- **Computer Networks**: *IP addresses, subnet masks, binary and hexadecimals and decimals, the different layers and protocols of the OSI-model, Cisco Packet Tracer, Wireshark*

- **Application Prototyping**: Designing and prototyping an application with models and tools like figma

- Web Pentesting Fundamentals: Ethical hacking, BurpSuite, XSS, SQLi, brute force attack, directory traversal...

- **Web Development Essentials**: Backend and frontend of a web app with use of Javascript, HTML, CSS, PHP, Laravel, SQLite

- **Cultural and Socio-economic Introduction to Belgium**: Facts and history of Belgium and some Dutch lessons

- **International Project**: Collaboration with students from other universities/fields to build something together. Fun activities included during the week as well.

Academic Experience

- 1. How helpful was the *receiving school* in the process of choosing classes and settling you in?
